

Special interest attaches to the Malay collections in Dresden, containing comparatively numerous sets of the glazed earthenware, so highly prized by many of these islanders. It is strange to find among so uncivilised a people as the Dyaks as strong a mania for collecting as is to be found in any people of Europe. They have quite a passion for the vessels of glazed ware, called dyawets, which are of a yellowish brown, dark brown, or gray-green colour, the poorest without decoration, the more precious sort overlaid with scales, adorned with wavy lines, or--in the most valuable sort--with large lizards in relief, which creep up the sides and twine round the neck of the vessel.s4 They are by no means attractive in appearance; but no collector of china in Europe is better acquainted with the value and classification of his collection, than the Dyak with his dyawets. Each kind has a special name, and belongs to a separate class, determined by the size and ornamentation. The plain ware is the least valued, the most highly prized being the large lizard vases, for which as much as 2000 florins is given. Their worth depends, as among the Javanese, on certain niceties of finish, which only the practised glance of a native can detect; and he is never mistaken. Europeans may be deceived by...
