The Hundred Mery Talys alluded to by Shakespeare in Much Ado about Nothing, have long been known to English readers by name; and an imperfect copy of the work was discovered, so far back as 1815, by the late Rev. J. J. Conybeare, and reprinted in the same year in S. W. Singers Jest Book, a book now very rare. Till within the last two or three years, it had been thought that the imperfect copy found by Mr. Conybeare was unique; but it appears that Dr. Oesterley lately met with another copy of the work in the library of the University of Gottingen, and that on carefully examining it, he found to his surprise that it was complete in every detail. The copy, it appears, was purchased for the University library in 1768, but nearly a century passed away before its real value as a curiosity was known. It is only fair to state here, that in 1864 Mr. Hazlitt reprinted the imperfect original which Mr. Conybeare had discovered fifty years before, so that the main substance of the...
