Excerpt from The Thompson Yates and Johnston Laboratories Report, Vol. 7: February, 1906 Male (fig. 1). - Body rather slender. Head as broad as long, quadrangular, posterior angles with a large flat chitinous expansion from which arises a stout hair extending backwards and reaching slightly beyond the insertion of the third pair of legs. Mentum with six short, curved spines, arranged in a circlet; beyond the mentum is a bilateral series of three larger spines, arranged somewhat in the form of a circle. Mesothorax with two long, stiff hairs, widely separated. Antennae (fig. 2) stout, of five segments; first segment much the largest, broader than long, the length equalling half the width of the head; second segment simple; third segment the shortest, anteriorly produced into a long, blunt, curved spine; fourth segment simple, not quite as long as the second; apical segment shorter than the fourth, apex truncate, bearing three or four minute spines; margins of all the joints more or less highly chitinised. Leg i. shorter than the rest; leg ii. (fig. 3) similar to leg...
