The latter, which is recorded as a failure, showed nothing unusual in the extraction until after the expulsion of the lens, when the Bowman spoon was used in manipulating the cornea so as to more perfectly restore the dislocated iris, the wound suddenly widely gaped, and from one quarter to one third of the vitreous suddenly es caped. No speculum was used; the eye was looking to the front, there was absolutely no faulty conduct on the part of the patient, and I could not in the least account for the accident. No violent reaction occurred;...
