In the tradition of good essay writing he weaves an elegant use of the language around important social and political issues and entertains the reader at the same time. Although these essays are short and can be quickly read, they question what we should expect of ourselves, our society, and our government. Fernando Garavito has a distinguished career as a professor and writer in Colombia but had to leave the country after receiving death threats as a result of his investigative journalism work. He came to the United States in exile in association with the Cities of Asylum program. These essays were written in the United States. This item ships from multiple locations.
