A circular cover will not consent to be applied to a square cell, and a circular cell will not act well with a square cover glass. It is here a case of like to like so far as form is concerned. But to make a square cell a pattern is necessary. This may be easily made by drawing with ink a square on card-board and placing the slip above it. The square cell may then be prepared by the application of the brushful of the semi-uid cement, and set aside to dry. If one applica tion of the cement does not make the cell deep enough, as it probably Will not, other layers may be added after those beneath are dry, or...
