Much lower wages were paid to the girls who received only one meal a day, over half (56.8 per cent.) of whom earned an average wage of less than 4 a week. These women, however, are usually short-time workers, the majority of them working less than thirty hours a week, and do not have to depend entirely upon their earnings in the restaurant to cover the cost of living. The highest wages were paid, as might be expected, to women who were not furnished with meals, two-thirds (64.2 per cent.) of whom earned 9 or over a week, a number earning as much as 12, and some even more. It is true that one-fourth (26.0 per cent.) of this group earned an average weekly wage of less than 6,...
