He is the only person to win a Nobel Prize for Literature, an Academy Award, and a Tony Award. The Nobel was in recognition of St. Joan in 1925. The Academy Award was for the Screenplay for Pygmalion in 1938. The musical version of Pygmalion, My Fair Lady, won nine Tony Awards in 1956 and the Academy Award for Best Picture in 1964. Shaw was a man of contradictions. His father was a drunkard; Shaw never drank. Despite being an avowed socialist and atheist, he wrote that attending church was the best substitute for a life of debauchery. He was a free-spirit who was against such social constraints as marriage, but felt that everyone should become a vegetarian. He was an Irish national who lived in England. (Most Americans do not understand this irony.) His dramatic and musical criticism were grounded in the academic and cultural standards of his day, yet after age 15 he was self-taught at the British Museum, like Karl Marx. He was a wit whose aphorisms still make for compelling sound bytes as he is...
