My pain is still excruciating and unchanged. As I sit before you today, I have chest pains, headaches and painful legs and feet. If a doctor with the VA tested me right now, everything would be found within normal limits of abnormality. But I question what is the normal limits of abnormality for an illness the VA knows little about. With these limitations and diagnoses...



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
