

Below is a list of the prizewinners during the period 2001-2005 with a description of the works which won them their prizes: (2001) George A Akerlof, A Michael Spence and Joseph Stiglitz - for their analyses of markets with asymmetric information; (2002) Daniel Kahneman - for having integrated insights from psychological research into economic science, especially concerning human judgment and decision-making under uncertainty and Vernon L Smith - for having established laboratory experiments as a tool in empirical economic analysis, especially in the study of alternative market mechanisms; and, (2003) Robert F Engle III - for methods of analyzing economic time series with time-varying volatility (ARCH) and Clive W J Granger - for methods of analyzing economic time series with common trends (cointegration). It also includes: (2004) Finn E Kydland and Edward C Prescott - for their contributions to dynamic macroeconomics - the time consistency of economic policy and the driving forces behind business cycles; and, (2005) Robert J Aumann and Thomas C Schelling - for having enhanced our understanding of conflict and cooperation through game-theory analysis.
