

General Roswell Sabin Ripley was the son of Christopher Ripley, who was commissioned a captain in the United States Army, by President Madison, and served during the War of 1812. General Ripley was born in Worthington, Ohio, 14th of March, 1823; entered West Point Academy from New York, 1839, and graduated in 1843 with distinction in a class noted for its ability and proficiency.
