The Muslim population of Europe in the period from 1918-1939 was not one of isolated islands of belief and practice. Rather, there was far more interaction between Muslim communities than had hitherto been imagined. For example, there was much correspondence and exchange of ideas between the Ahmadi-Lahori missions of Berlin and Woking, near London, and Albanian religious leaders. Other topics discussed in this book include the earlier than imagined emergence of notions of a distinctly European Islam, the fraught interplay of politics and Islam, especially the development by some governments of Muslim agendas , the richness and importance of debates within Europe's Muslim community, the attempts by the Nazis to foment jihad and the modus operandi of trans-national networks.
