Not all assessment items can be uniformly classified as problems or nonproblems, as noted earlier. Items must be considered in terms of intended grade age levels and the content or experiences related to the problem students have likely experienced in school or life settings. How Can Problem Solving Be Assessed Earlier examinations of work on assessing students problem-solving capabilities identify various important components of assessments, such as ways of addressing inductive and analogical reasoning (Csap 1997; Vosniadou and Ortony 1989) or methods of addressing varying levels of cognitive complexity (Bloom, Hasting, and Madaus 1971; Collis, Romberg, and Jurdak 1986).
