WATCH SERVICES. ---The American District Telegraph Company has recently organized a watch service in connection with its Pittsburgh office, Its Allegheny circuit serves four subscribers with 37 boxes, including four manual fire alarm boxes, which are different from those operated by the night watch. The circuit, which is normally closed, runs underground in the downtown districts of Allegheny and Pittsburgh, and elsewhere overhead. Alarms are self-recording in the Pittsburgh office of the Company, whence they are forwarded nianually to the Fire Alarm Headquarters at Allegheny. They are sent out to Engine Houses as regular alarms. Men are employed for runners and are sent to subscribers premises whenever the watchmans box signal is more than fifteen minutes over-due.
