

Now, permit me to enquire, whether gentlemen of the East supposed, when such an apportionment was made, that Democrats--Western Democrats--were to be whipped into the support of anything so monstrous, so outrageously unjust The first wrong is to be visited upon the West, and that wrong begets another, which is to be visited upon the Whigs.
