Battison, Assistant Secretary and Statistician of the National Association of Wool Manufacturers, died at his home in Needham at the ripe age of seventy-eight years. Born in Amptill, Bedford County, England, he was brought, when a very young boy, to this country by his mother to join his father, a carpenter and worker in hard wood, who had been settled in Boston for a few years before their arrival. The son attended the Grammar schools of the city, and after spending two years in the High School, where he was awarded one of the highly prized Franklin medals for scholarship, became a bookkeeper for the Leatherbee Lumber Company. Marrying soon thereafter he left the company and sold lumber on commission, securing through his friend, Frank W. Williams, an assistant of Dr. John L. Hayes, desk room in the office of the National Association of Wool Manufacturers, whose headquarters...
