Harrison's life story puts a human face on the suffering wrought by twentieth-century US Indian policy. Historic and contemporary photographs enliven the text and depict the trauma of forced assimilation. Former Senator Mark Hatfield's foreword places Harrison in the annals of Native leaders, where her generosity of spirit shines through as she seeks to contribute to the communities that threatened to engulf her tribe's homeland. The Grande Rondes have achieved national renown as the 'little tribe that could', and at the forefront for over two decades stood four-foot eleven-inch Kathryn Harrison.
