Most of the exposures are in the northern part of the state relatively distant from ready markets. This makes it difficult for the Michigan burners to compete in the southern more populous portion of the state with lime producers in northern Ohio, Indiana, and Illinois, situated near cheap coal fuel supplies. Concrete mortar is more easily and rapidly handled than stone and lime mortar and has largely displaced these materials in the building trades.
