It would be hard to point to anything in English which attempts to handle the matter seriously, with the exception of some pages in Grotes History and in Mr. Richards Platonica. Hence the very careful and thoroughgoing examination of the whole subject which Mr. Hackforth offers in the volume before us fills a real gap, and deserves, if only on that account, a grateful welcome from all students of Classics. The most important of the more modern criticisms of the Epistles are those by Raeder, Ritter and R. Adam; and the present work is largely based on these, especially in regard to linguistic statistics. Mr. Hackforths method is to deal with the Epistles one by one, giving a summary of the contents of each, and then passing...
