

Must be protected from mechanical injury, when necessary on side walls, by a substantial boxing, retaining an air space of one inch around the conductors, closed at the top, and extending not less than five feet from the floor, or by an iron-armored or a metal-sheathed insulating conduit sufficiently strong to withstand the strain it will be subjected to, the inner insulating tubing to extend one-half inch beyond the ends of the metal tube, which must extend not less than five feet from the floor. When crossing exposed floor timbers in cellars or rooms, the conductors must be attached by their insulating supports...
