Some of Spares techniques, particularly the use of sigils and the creation of an alphabet of desire were adopted, adapted and popularized by Peter J. Carroll in the work Liber Null and Psychonaut. Carroll and other writers such as Ray Sherwin are seen as key figures in the emergence of some of Spares ideas and techniques as a part of a magical movement loosely referred to as chaos magic. Zos Kia Cultus is a term coined by Kenneth Grant, with different meanings for different people. One interpretation is that it is a form, style, or school of magic inspired by Spare. It focuses on ones individual universe and the influence of the magicians will on it. While the Zos Kia Cultus has very few adherents today, it is widely considered an important influence on the rise of chaos magic. This item ships from La Vergne, TN. Paperback.
