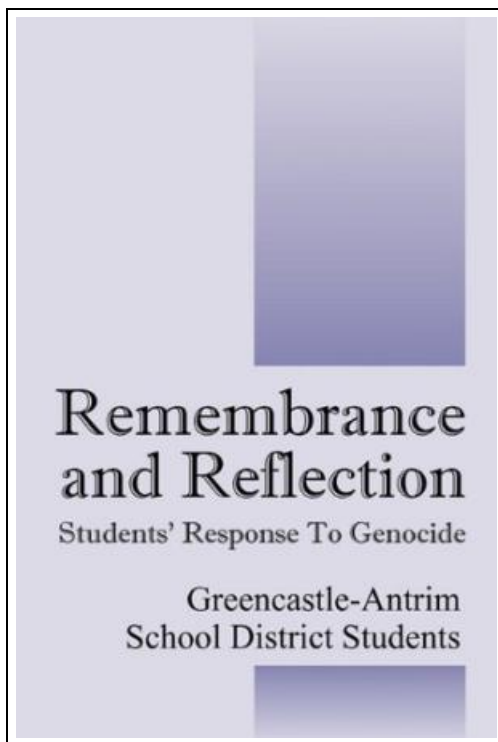

When the International Military Tribunal held at Nuremberg, Germany, charged top Nazis with crimes against humanity, the term genocide was included in the indictment. Since that time, many cases of group-targeted extermination have occurred. Even today, over 60 years later, preventing genocide remains a challenge that nations and individuals continue to face. In *Remembrance and Reflection: Students Response to Genocide*, students who studied the Holocaust, ranging from eighth grade through college level, have taken up the genocide- prevention challenge. As British philosopher Edmund Burke observed, All that it takes for evil to prosper is for good men to do nothing. In this anthology, contributing young writers have done something. In their touching and poignant poetry, short stories, essays, and letters, they have increased our awareness of the human spirit and the depraved mind. In their reflections and inspirational tributes, they have brought to our memory the estimated 170 million civilians who were mass murdered in genocides of the twentieth century. And by their shared insights and youthful interpretations of tragedies past, this anthology keeps the memory of the fallen innocents alive in the hearts and minds of those of us who perhaps never knew, but now will never forget.
